# **Keyboarding & Visual Motor Integration**

An important component of keyboarding is visual motor integration. Visual motor integration measures a child's ability to make sense of visual information and then use it appropriately for a motor task such as writing, playing sports, using tools and utensils, and keyboarding.

## Tips for teaching keyboarding

- Set realistic goals
- Teach letter keys in groups (i.e home row)
- Mark key groups with brightly colored stickers. 1 color for left hand, another color for right hand
- · Focus on technique and accuracy before speed
- Provide a picture of the keyboard next to the screen.
   Encourage kids to look at the picture rather than looking down at the keyboard
- Our muscles learn from repetition. The more they practice, the easier it will be for their muscles to "learn" this new skill


