OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY'S ROLE IN RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION (RTI)

Tier 1

Provide staff development training

Provide Handwriting Proficiency Screenings

Provide large group instruction to enhance a student's development through the push in model

Maintain adaptive equipment supply in the building for trial

Provide mini in-services to classrooms

Provide classroom groups in sensory, fine motor, visual perception

Tier 2

Provide adaptations and specific training based on individual student's needs such as:

Pencil grips Slant boards Adapted seating Special paper Sensory tools

Make recommendations regarding handwriting curriculum, fine motor tools, classroom furniture, and sensory

Teacher to complete "Request for Assistance" Form on students struggling in the area of handwriting, fine motor, sensory, and perception

Tier 3

Handwriting Tutoring Groups

Identified through the "Request for Assistance" process

Individual instruction for student's identified as struggling in handwriting that do not have an IEP

Pull-out model 4-6 in a group

Progress monitored through the Screener of Handwriting Proficiency
